Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have all had a very busy, amazing week of learning adventures. It started off with Oak class swimming and all classes attending trips to the CoalPort China Museum as part of the Broseley School's Forging Ahead project. The children enjoyed a multitude of activities and came back with a raised awareness of their local history. Elm class made their own Broseley Dragons, which are displayed in their classroom at the moment. It has been wonderful to hear the children talk about their local history and develop their local awareness during this project. All children returned home with a miniature Broseley Dragon, and humming a song, sung by the children and workers, during the Industrial Revolution.

On Tuesday morning, we welcomed Les from the Telford & Wrekin Interfaith Council into school. He spoke to the whole school on the theme of diversity.
